Barbara Yerace will be presenting a talk highlighting the inspiration and passion in creating her beaded animal stories and bead work. Directly after the talk, each participant will have the opportunity to make a small beaded wearable pin using the same technique she uses in creating her beaded art.

The talk and workshop are free to the public and funded by the National Endowment for the Arts granted to Erie Arts and Culture for the Northwestern PA Arts Recovery Grant, received by Barbara Yerace. Between 1903 and 1906, New York society architects Carrère and Hastings built the white stucco Goodyear Cottage for Frank Henry Goodyear, who made his fortune in timber. The Goodyear family owned the cottage until about 1942. Following a 1974 restoration, the house became an art gallery occupied by the Jekyll Island Arts Association.

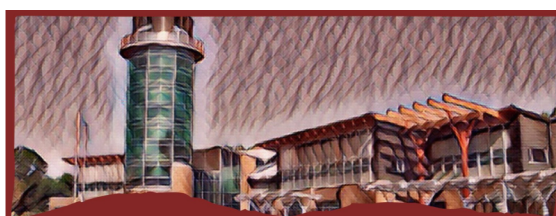

**SARAH'S WEEKNIGHT PASTA
BOLOGNESE**

INGREDIENTS

- 2 tablespoons good olive oil, plus extra to cook the pasta
- 1 pound lean ground sirloin (I use Wegman's extra lean 'meatloaf mix')
- 4 teaspoons minced garlic, 4 cloves (I always double garlic)
- 1 tablespoon dried oregano
- ¼ teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
- 1 ¼ cups dry red wine, divided
- 1, 28 oz. can crushed tomatoes, preferably San Marzano
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- dried pasta, such as orecchiette or small shells (I usually cook half to a full pound)
- ¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- ¼ cup chopped fresh basil leaves, lightly packed
- ¼ cup heavy cream
- ½ freshly grated Parmesan cheese, plus extra for serving

INSTRUCTIONS

Heat 2 teaspoons of olive oil in a large 12 inch skillet over medium-high heat. Add the ground sirloin and cook, crumbling the meat with a wooden spoon, for 5 to 7 minutes, until the meat has lost its pink color and started to brown. Stir in the garlic, oregano, and red pepper flakes and cook for 1 more minute. Pour 1 cup of the wine into the skillet and stir to scrape up any browned bits. Add the tomatoes, tomato paste, 1 tablespoon salt, 1 ½ teaspoons pepper, stirring until combined. Bring to a boil, lower the heat, and simmer for 10 minutes.

Meanwhile, bring a large pot of water to a boil, add a tablespoon of salt, a splash of oil, and the pasta, and cook according to the directions on the box.

While the pasta cooks, finish the sauce. Add the nutmeg, basil, cream, and the remaining ¼ cup wine to the sauce and simmer for 8-10 minutes, stirring occasionally until thickened.

When the pasta is cooked, drain and pour into a large serving bowl. Add the sauce and ½ cup Parmesan and toss well. Serve hot with Parmesan on the side.

I ALWAYS keep the pasta and sauce separate, until serving. It keeps much better for leftovers that way. Otherwise, it tends to dry out and lose significant flavor!



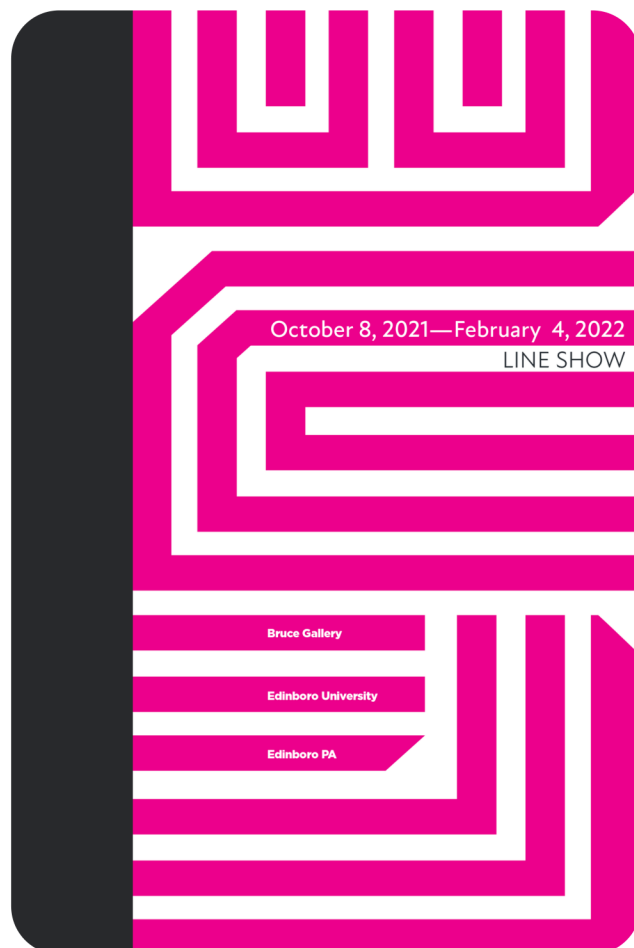

(sur)face: portraits re-examined, investigates a range of 2D, 3D and 4D works that embrace a form of portraiture.

The show features Murjoni Merriweather's mixed-media ceramic portrait sculptures and Madeline Schwartzman's photographs, linen prints and videos. In addition, an ephemeral bread-based sculpture by Dennis Doyle and a wood-collage painting by Edinboro University alumni **Carol Werder** will be displayed along with 17 works from the permanent collection including artists Edward Eberle, Degas, Bill Fick, Jasper Johns, Françoise Gilot, Ayanah Moor, Picasso, Rouault, Jenny Schmid and Raphael Soyer. A catalog designed by Emeritus Professor **Shelle Barron** will feature essays by Brooklyn Rail critic Ann Collins, Penn State Art History student Celine Gauge, MOCA Cleveland curator Lauren Leving and Pittsburgh-based critic and gallerist Kilolo Luckett.
