CALLING ALL ARTISTS

THE PAUL AND NORMA TIKKANEN **PAINTING PRIZE**

Paul Tikkanen was a contemporary abstract painter, sculptor, and photographer born in Ashtabula in 1926. He was a graduate of Ashtabula Harbor High School and the Cleveland Institute of Art. Tikkanen was a 1957 winner of the Cleveland Art Museum's May Show for his painting "Chipped Crystal." He married his wife Norma Stenberg Tikkanen in 1958; Norma was born in Saybrook, Ohio. Paul and Norma traveled extensively during their life together, visiting Mexico, Europe, North Africa, and the Middle East. Paul studied, created, and showed art around the world, and worked in the United States as a draftsman, carpenter, boiler operator, sign painter, commercial artist, and portrait painter. He and Norma renovated the Old Ninevah School in Geneva. Ohio into an art studio, and he later established a studio on Lake Jun 1-Jul 16, 2023: Art Call digital first round application (include high Road. Paul was devoted to Norma, and was her primary caregiver at the end of her life. Paul Tikkanen hoped to see visual arts flourish in our area, and wanted to encourage and promote both established and rising fine arts painters in Northeast Ohio and Northwest Pennsylvania. To help realize that goal, he left an endowment to the Ashtabula Arts Center Foundation to establish a painting competition. This competition, the Paul and Norma Tikkanen Painting Prize, will be held annually beginning October 2022. Prizes will be given in two categories, abstract and realistic, awarding first place winners \$12,000 and second place winners \$5000. Potential Honorable Mention prizes of \$1000 may also be awarded at the discretion of the jurors. Acceptable media for entries include gouache, fresco, encaustic, ink (sumi-e), oil, acrylic, watercolor, alcohol inks, tempora, and mixed media painting.

Entry Fee:

\$15 per piece. Each applicant limited to 2 entires.

Rights and Responsibilities:

All accepted artworks must remain at the AAC through October 31 Gallery will collect 30% commission on all sales.

AAC shall have the right to use images of exhibited artworks for the catalog and all promotional purposes.

Artwork dropoff and pick up must be done in person. All works will be signed into and out of the AAC.

All pieces must be wired ready to hang. Works which are not appropriately wired will not be displayed. Unclaimed artwork becomes the property of the AAC on Nov 12, 2023.

Artworks are covered by insurance while in possession of the AAC. They are not covered during transportation to and from the AAC. The Arts Center has the right to accept or reject any artworks for any reason.

Prizes will be awarded for abstract & realistic work Categorization of individual works will be decided by the judges Accepted mediums: Gouache, Fresco, Encaustic, Ink (Sumi-e), Oil, Acrylic, Watercolor, Alcohol Inks, Tempera, Mixed Media Painting (Jurors will have final say on acceptable mediums. 85% of the painting should be a painting medium.) Originals only; no giclees, no prints, no wet paint.

Pre-wired; include a fragile piece disclaimer if needed Completed in the last 3 years Maximum size 4ftx4ft; max weight 25lbs High school students not eligible






